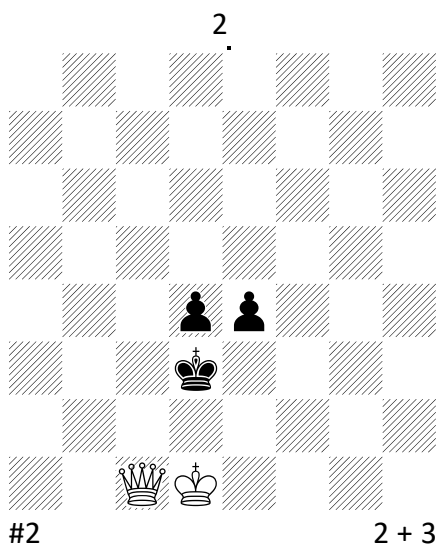

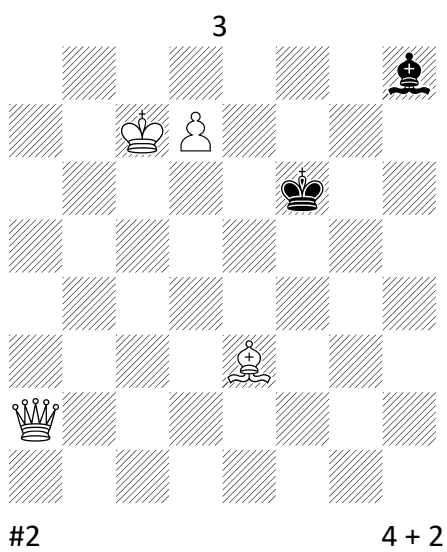

De dame maakt veld e3 vrij voor de zwarte koning en switcht dan effectief naar de andere vleugel. Een leuke miniatuur.

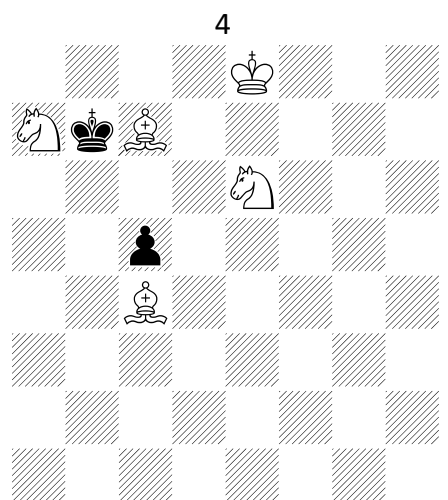

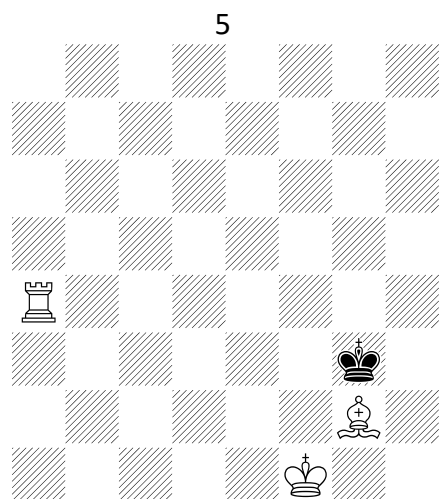

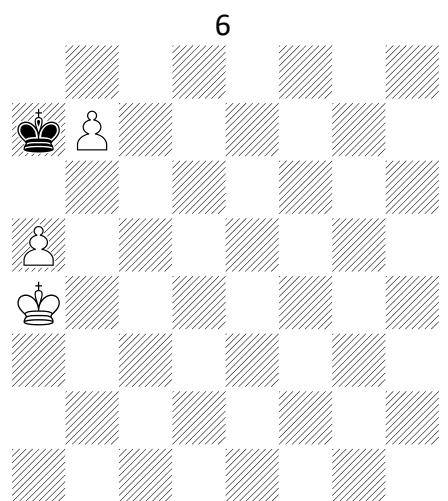
